solely decide on accommodations or modifications for students with learning difficulties

A Remedial Teacher does...

A Remedial Teacher does NOT...



provide feedback on the students' progress to their classroom teacher

assess reading for students they are supporting

help students with the use of assistive technology as outlined in their IEP

require a substitute or replacement should they be absent



evaluate or produce grades for students' report cards

administer DRAs for whole groups nor replace a teacher while they administer them

read or scribe for a student during evaluations

have a role that is clearly outlined by the collective agreement**
