assess reading and/or

help students with
the use of assistive
technology as

or replacement
should they be
absent

evaluate or produce
grades for students'
report cards

administer reading or
Math assessments for
whole groups nor
replace a teacher while
they administer them

read or scribe for a
student during
evaluations

have a role that is
clearly outlined by the
collective agreement
